



It's sunny in Dubai for most of the year and the winter months December to March are quite pleasant, with short spells of rainfall. It is important to keep well hydrated and protected in the sun at all times.



LANGUAGE

The national language spoken is Arabic but English is widely used. However, Dubai is home to many different nationalities with an array of languages spoken.



BANKS

Many international banks are represent by branches in Dubai. Bank hours are subject to the location and branch. Opening hours are usually 8:00 am to 3:00 pm and as late as 9:00 pm in some malls. Saturday to Sunday



GEOGRAPHY



Dubai lies on the Gulf of the northern shore of the Arabian peninsula, bordered by the Emirates of Abu Dhabi, Sharjah, and Sultanate of Oman. This part of the Arabian desert is sandy rather than gravelly, with maiestic dunes and little water other than the Dubai Creek. The Hajar mountains lie to the southeast.



COMMUNICATION

There are many readily available communication methods in Dubai. With international dialing telephones, postal and courier services Dubai is a central hub for global connection. Electronic mail and fax facilities are also widely available.



VISA & ENTRY FORMALITIES

Citizens of Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries and a numbers specified can enter without a visa. Please be aware of the latest regulations that apply (they do occasionally change) at the website of the General Directorate of Residency & Foreign Affairs Dubai.





SUBJECT: UAE CUSTOMS

With immediate effect, the following has been enforced on all visiting yachts by UAE customs.

With the re-enforcement of the Customs rules and procedures, clearance of ship's spares in transit as transshipment is only permitted for Yachts moored at the Customs regulated zones (Commercial Ports / Customs Entry & Exit Points) which does not include the Marinas.

For yachts moored outside the Customs regulated zones, shipments will be imported and cleared by JLS Yachts on behalf of the Yacht subjected to a non-refundable customs duty payment.










Dubai has transformed from a humble fishing village to one of the most cosmopolitan and innovative cities in the world today. Tracing its origins back to 3,000 BC, Dubai's inhabitants made their livelihood from fishing, pearl diving, boat building and sea trading, before the discovery of oil in the late 1960s. In 1971, Dubai joined its neighbours to form the United Arab Emirates, safeguarding the area's prosperity.

Getting to Dubai





With over 7,000 weekly flights operated by 125 airlines from 260 destinations on every continent (except Antarctica), you have a wide range of options to choose from when flying to Dubai. It's easy to find a carrier to fit any budget or itinerary.



BY LAND: Planning a road trip? A first-rate network of roads and highways connects Dubai and its neighbouring emirates, making it a great way to explore the country. An Emirate Route Number designates highways and main roads in Dubai and the United Arab Emirates. In the UAE, cars drive on the right side.

Speed limits are clearly displayed and are usually 60-80km/h (37-50mph) around town and 100-120km/h (60-75mph) on highways.



BY CRUISE: Dubai Cruise Terminal in Mina Rashid is one of the most luxurious ports to dock at, receiving about half a million visitors each year.

Dubai is a city that must be seen to be believed. Record-breaking architecture stands alongside traditional quarters, while man-made islands jut out of the coastline. Here are the top places to tick off your sightseeing list when you're in town.



The Dubai Fountain

Witness water dance at the iconic Dubai Fountain, located at the base of the Burj Khalifa. The world's largest choreographed fountain system features a sound and light show which shoots 22,000 gallons of water as high as 150m in the air.

Each brightly illuminated jet sways in time to music, producing what has become one of Dubai's most popular shows. Situated outside The Dubai Mall, make time to shop between evening water shows, which begin every 30 minutes.



Dubai Opera

Experience the region's contemporary cultural scene at Dubai Opera, the city's latest architectural masterpiece.

Shaped like a futuristic dhow, this institution hosts a stellar program of international names and local legends in opera, ballet, theatre and music.

Designed by Danish architect Janus Rostock & located in the heart of Downtown Dubai, the 2,000 seat Dubai Opera is a world-class cultural facility.



Madinat Jumeiral

For an experience that marries tradition and luxury, head to Madinat Jumeirah. Literally translated as 'City of Jumeirah' this complex is inspired by an ancient citadel complete with windtowers and water canals. It encloses luxury hotels, private enclaves built in the traditional style, the world-class Talise Spa, Madinat Souk, Madinat Theatre, and more than 40 restaurants and lounges including several like folly by Nick & Scott which overlooks the sea from windtowers.

You can also explore the complex waterways on a traditional wooden abra to better appreciate the serene passages and inspired architecture.



Buri Khalif

Soaring 828m above Dubai and currently the world's tallest building, the Burj Khalifa represents a union of art, engineering and heritage. It's home to office space, private residences, the 160-room Armani Hotel and At the Top's observation decks on the 124th and 148th floors. At mosphere is the world's highest restaurant, with stunning views and an equally stellar menu. There are also more than 1,000 specially commissioned works of art throughout the building.



Dalm Jumpiral

Gracing the city's postcards, the iconic Palm Jumeirah is an astounding feat of mankind in the form of a series of artificial archipelagos in the emerald waters of the Arabian Gulf. From above, it takes the form of a stylised palm tree

At ground level, it has some of the city's most popular beach clubs, celebrity chef restaurants and luxury hotels, including the pink arches of Atlantis, The Palm. Sail around Palm Jumeirah or get a bird's-eye view from a jump with Skydive Dubai.




Dubai Water Canal

The Dubai Water Canal is a 3.2km waterway which winds its way to the Arabian Gulf from the creek in Old Dubai through Business Bay. Along the canal's waterfront are prime Dubai hotels such as W Dubai and the St Regis, as well as a running and cycling track. It will eventually create 80,000sqm of public space to include new hotels and dining and shopping outlets.



City Walk

Stroll through City Walk – Dubai's newest al fresco shopping district. This chic urban space features an excellent range of boutiques, entertainment centres and restaurants, some whose shopfronts are inspired by London's streets. Enjoy entertainment zones like Hub Zero, The Green Planet and Roxy Cinemas or kick back in the new La Ville Hotel's garden terrace. With a striking skyline view that includes the Burj Khalifa, City Walk is a perfect location for a day or night out.

Dubai Aquarium & Underwater Zoo

Discover one of the world's most visited destinations, The Dubai Mall. Located at the foot of Burj Khalifa,

this shopping metropolis features more than 1,200 retail outlets, restaurants (some with views of The Dubai

Fountain), a mega bookshop, an aquarium, spas and even an ice rink. Fashionistas won't want to miss

Fashion Avenue featuring the iconic Level Shoes district, while kids will flock straight to Reel Cinema as well

The 10 million-litre tank at the Dubai Aquarium is one of the largest in the world, containing more than 33,000 aquatic animals and the largest collection of sand tiger sharks anywhere. Rising to the third floor of The Dubai Mall, the aquarium is home to 140 species of sea life and has several ways to experience underwater life, starting with a stroll through a 48m walk-through tunnel. It's a complete fish-eye view, with sand tiger sharks and stingrays swimming overhead. You can also take a glass-bottom boat tour, get wet in a snorkeling cage and even don an oxygen tank to go swimming with the sharks.



Dubai Historical District

Discover old Dubai in Al Fahidi Historical Neighbourhood, where winding stone alleys & charismatic windtower architecture reflect life before skyscrapers.

Follow the alleyways to hidden tea houses, art galleries and cultural installations that uncover Dubai's past. Afterward, head toward the bustling abra station and take a ride across the creek.

There you will find gold, spice, perfume and textile souks where you can bargain over excellent handicrafts and goods.



Skydive Dubai

Soar like a bird over one of the most spectacular drop zones in the world with Skydive Dubai. Step out of a plane at an altitude of almost 4,000m and enjoy the rush. To make sure you remember the experience forever, a cameraman documents the fun. The freefall lasts around a minute before your instructor pops the chute and you begin a leisurely five-minute descent with incredible views of Palm Jumeirah and other iconic landmarks. For an alternative view, try the desert drop zone.



Have fun on the water and at the same time take in some of Dubai's famous landmarks with a jet-ski session. Nemo Watersports and Dubai Jetski offer tours that takes in the Burj Al Arab hotel and other sights from the water. Each tour is accompanied by a qualified instructor and you can go as fast or slow as you like, for anywhere from 30 minutes to two hours

The 30-minute tour features Burj Al Arab while an hour-long session takes you onwards to Jumeirah Beach Residences. The deluxe two-hour version includes this, while also circumnavigating the famous Palm Jumeirah and stopping off at Atlantis, The Palm.



Quad Biking

Direct your taxi driver to Dubai's most famous sand dune, Big Red, where you can hop on a guad bike and navigate the sandy landscape yourself.

Available to hire by the half hour, the quad bikes are speedy and a helmet must be worn while riding.

Follow the natural trail of the dunes, kicking sand in the face of your fellow riders as you hurtle and bounce over Dubai's most iconic patch of sand. Big Red, or Al Hamar as it's locally known, is easy to spot along the Dubai-Hatta (E44) highway. Ask your driver to wait, or hire one for the day.



Sandboarding

This is one for true adrenaline-seekers. Strap this snowboardlike contraption to your feet and glide down the dunes just like you would at the slopes of Ski Dubai. While it's possible to rent a sand board at Big Red, there are a number of companies such as Dream Explorer Dubai - that offer the full experience. The five-hour morning safari and sandboarding package starts off with a desert safari in a Hummer and ends with a sandboarding session, where you'll learn all the tips

for making it down the dunes smoothly.







HISTORY

Historically, the creek divided the city into two main sections - Deira and Bur Dubai. It was along the Bur Dubai creek area that members of the Bani Yas tribe first settled in the 19th century, establishing the Al Maktoum dynasty in the city.

In the early 20th century, the creek, though incapable then of supporting large scale transportation, served as a minor port for dhows coming from as far away as India or East Africa. Although it impeded the entry of ships due to current flow, the creek remained an important element in establishing the commercial position of Dubai, being the only port or harbour in the city.

Dubai's pearling industry, which formed the main sector of the city's economy, was based primarily on expeditions in the creek, prior to the invention of cultured pearls in the 1930s.



Fishing, also an important industry at the time, was also based along the creek, whose warm and shallow waters supported a wide variety of marine life. Dhows used for purposes of fishing were also built on the foreshore of the creek.

The importance of the creek as a site of commercial activity was a justification to introduce improvements to allow larger vessels to transit, as well as to facilitate loading and unloading activities. This led, in 1955, to a plan to develop the creek, which involved dredging shallow areas. building of breakwaters, and developing its beach to become a quay suitable for loading and unloading of cargo.

The creek was first dredged in 1961 to permit 7-foot (2.1 m) draft vessels to cross through the creek at all times. The creek was dredged again in the 1960s and 1970s so that it could offer anchorage for local and coastal shipping of up to about 500 tons. The dredging opened up the creek to much more continuous traffic of merchandise, including the development of re-export, and gave Dubai an advantage over Sharjah, the other dominant trading centre in the region at the time.

Al Maktoum Bridge, the first bridge connecting Bur Dubai and Deira was constructed in 1963. Although the importance of the creek as a port has diminished with the development of the Jebel Ali Port, smaller facilities, such as Port Saeed, continue to exist along the creek, providing porting to traders from the region and the subcontinent.


Including the most remarkable buildings alongside the Deira side of the Creek are the Deira Twin Towers, the old Dubai Creek Tower, Sheraton Dubai Creek, National Bank, and Chamber of Commerce. On the other side of Al Maktoum Bridge along Dubai Creek is Dubai Creek Park, one of the largest parks in Dubai.

The creek is also home to the Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club, comprising an 18-hole tournament golf course, clubhouses, residential development and the Park Hvatt hotel.

The creek's initial inlet into mainland Dubai is along the Deira Corniche and Al Ras areas of eastern Dubai and along the Al Shindagha area of western Dubai. It then progresses south-eastward through the mainland, passing through Port Saeed and Dubai Creek Park. The creek's natural ending is at the Ras Al Khor Wildlife Sanctuary, 14 kilometres (8.7 mi) from its origin at the Persian Gulf.

The traditional form of transport between the eastern and western sections of Dubai via the creek was through abras, which continue to operate in Dubai. In addition, the eastern and western sections are linked via four bridges (Al Maktoum Bridge, Al Garhoud Bridge, Business Bay Crossing, and Floating Bridge) and one tunnel (Al Shindagha Tunnel).

Dubai Creek is one the emirate's most picturesque locales that particularly stick out for its traditional aura and charm. Despite the record-breaking landmarks comprising high-rise buildings and entertainment venues that dot across the city, this natural seawater creek stands as the real identity of Dubai and is a living illustration of the country's long-standing trading tradition.

Dubai as an international yachting destination?



- A UNIQUE PERSPECTIVE



International Waterfront Consultants | IWC's Managing Director, Paul Lane, arrived on the shores of Dubai almost 20 years ago. Since then, much has changed. The size and scale of the Emirates development now forms part of international folklore, and yet the Emirates and especially Dubai, have clearly more to come; particularly in the yachting segment. Lane - a former super-yacht Captain - holds Dubai's leisure marine opportunities in high regard; especially the potential to grow its leisurebased nautical tourism opportunities to the international market.

"Cruise ships grab the headlines, but the world has seen a huge increase in nautical tourism, rather than maritime tourism, over the last three decades. However, the steadfast markets and regions retain the lion's share. In 2014, the Mediterranean was responsible for 70% of the worlds charter market, and new developments in the Eastern Mediterranean are likely to reinforce this position," says Lane.

And herein is where IWC see the opportunity lying. "Dubai and the Emirates as a whole have made huge investment in marina infrastructure over the years. The amount of marina berths in the UAE has tripled over the past two decades, and we see an increasing number of super- and mega-yachts in the waters of the Emirates. However, most of these vessels are homeported either locally or regionally. The number of visiting foreign flagged yachts remains very low and currently shows no significant signs of growth. Greater access to transient berthing is clearly required – just ask Captain Steve Corbett from JLS Yachts."


"There are clearly many factors affecting Dubai's image as an international yachting destination. Not all can be addressed directly by the Emirates themselves but many factors can be." Lane should know having served as General Manager for Yas Marina & Yacht Club overseeing the construction and subsequent management of the facility from its inauguration in 2008 until 2011. "The business model for marina development and operation has to evolve. It is currently somewhat trapped in the outdated and antiquated owner-developed, owner-provided annual rental model. This mindset is driving all of the marinas to be basically 'the same.' Long-term berth ownership is a must and an easy way to accelerate the promotion of Dubai, not just as a destination for the international market, but as a regional base for exploration. That exploration will grow further if the UAE ensign can become a flag of convenience to many international yacht owners. Likewise, the number of foreign flagged vessels that base themselves for extended periods in the UAE's waters would further increase if the opportunity for chartering was provided. The parallels with the UAE's world-leading residential and hospitality markets are obvious."

Lane continues, "The Great Southern Route hasn't developed as many thought it would. Southeast Asia is clearly benefiting from it but charting course to the far side of the world is predominantly east-to-west or around South Africa. The Pacific is clearly winning over the Indian Ocean. Closer alliances to neighbouring countries, and dare it be said – GCC-wide cruising permits – would provide a huge shot of adrenaline to the industry. Admittedly, the latter is clearly a long way off, but the Middle East is a part of the world that can affect change quickly and simply, so it stands to reason that Dubai could lead the way.

The much-hyped Red Sea projects are clearly huge for nautical tourism in the Region. If only a small percentage of the yachts in the Mediterranean are convinced to make the trip through the Suez Canal to the Red Sea, then figuratively speaking, they are halfway to Dubai. Oman's Mina Qaboos development will likely form a gateway for the Arabian Sea and the Gulf for the larger yachts and heavy lift float on-float off ships stand ready to ease the burden of the journey for smaller vessels. Markets such as India, Sri Lanka, Maldives, etc are finally making steps forward that will also reinforce their yachting markets in general. New marinas also need to put much stronger focus on the needs of larger yachts. A majority of the marinas we see emerging still miss out on the opportunity of being best-in-class."

Lane is clearly an optimist and believes strongly in the potential opportunity but is cautious. "Nautical tourism should be thought of as the icing on the cake, for it to flourish it requires a strong domestic market and core industry

Service providers to the yachting industry depend on the homeport vessels to maintain their ability to react when visiting vessels arrive. Dubai and the Emirates have strong shipyards that are constantly improving their ability to service the luxury yacht segment. Agents such as JLS Yachts lead the way in concierge and convenience. Although 2018 has seen tough times for the domestic market, 2019 is likely to be tougher still. Now is the time to review the significant base that has been built and move forward in the most effective and efficient way possible. Too much overselling may well be problematic in an industry that is small, educated and well connected. Over hyping is likely to be counterproductive, there is enough for now and there is clearly more to come". Many may nod and recall the inaugural Formula 1 Etihad Airways Abu Dhabi Grand Prix and all that was achieved by Lane and his team in those early days at Yas Marina - a legacy that has already lived on for almost a decade.
