With its year-round sunshine, the capital's clear blue skies, tranquil beaches, vibrant city life and cosmopolitan city of culture has come together to create an ultimate destination offering remarkable experiences.





CLOTHING

Summer clothing may be worn for most of the year, the temperature can drop during the winter. At the pool or on the private beaches, swimwear is quite acceptable, but when in the city and public areas, care should be taken not to offend others by wearing clothing that may be considered revealing.



DRIVING

Cars are left-handed drive and proceed on the right side of the road as they do in Europe. (Note that international driving permits and overseas driving license are not valid in private cars in the UAE).



CURRENCY

The UAE Dirhams is the official currency (abbreviated as AED or DHS). You are likely to get preferable currency exchange rates at banks and private financial constitutios rather than at hotels. Visa and Mastercard credit cards are more widely accepted than AMEX or Diner's Club.



TIME ZONE

Dubai operates on Gulf Standard Time (GST), which is GMT +4. There is no daylight saving.



DRINKING WATER

Tap water is considered safe to drink, however it is common to drink bottled water as these are the procedures for service in hotels and restaurants.



ELECTRICITY

The electricity supply in Dubai is 220/240 volts at 50 cycles. U.S. or European made appliances may require a transformer and an adaptor.



PHOTOGRAPHY

There are many great opportunities to take photographs in Dubai, however, we do recommend you consider asking for permission before any photography, especially when people are involved.



MEDICAL CARE

Medical services in Dubai are of an international standard and are widely available.



CLIMATE

It's sunny in Dubai for most of the year and the winter months December to March are quite pleasant, with short spells of rainfall. It is important to keep well hydrated and protected in the sun at all times.



LANGUAGE

The national language spoken is Arabic but English is widely used. However, Dubai is home to many different nationalities with an array of languages spoken.



BANKS

Many international banks are represent by branches in Dubai. Bank hours are subject to the location and branch. Opening hours are usually 8:00 am to 3:00 pm and as late as 9:00 pm in some malls. Saturday to Sunday.



GEOGRAPHY

Dubai lies on the Gulf of the northern shore of the Arabian peninsula, bordered by the Emirates of Abu Dhabi, Sharjah, and Sultanate of Oman. This part of the Arabian desert is sandy rather than gravelly, with majestic dunes and little water other than the Dubai Creek. The Hajar mountains lie to the southeast.



COMMUNICATION

There are many readily available communication methods in Dubai. With international dialing telephones, postal and courier services Dubai is a central hub for global connection. Electronic mail and fax facilities are also widely available.



VISA & ENTRY FORMALITIES

Citizens of Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries and a numbers specified can enter without a visa. Please be aware of the latest regulations that apply (they do occasionally change) at the website of the General Directorate of Residency & Foreign Affairs Dubai.



- When passing any craft or vessel made fast to berth, pier or jetty the master of any craft shall reduce speed to reduce the effects of interaction and wash on the berthed vessel.
- Swimming is allowed only within the swimming zone areas. Scuba diving is not permitted anywhere within the Palm. Snorkelling is permitted only within the designated swimming zones.
- · Motorised water sports are not permitted.
- · Fishing of any description is not permitted.
- No waste is to be discharged into the water or on the land. Waste includes hazardous materials, oils, fuels, oily engine room bilge water, sewage (raw or treated), food items and plastics.
- \cdot The master shall ensure that the engines do not produce excessive smoke.
- · Touring other islands and island hopping is not permitted.
- · Excessive noise is prohibited.
- · Overnight stays are only permitted subject to prior approval.

Vessels may now visit West Bay Anchorage at Palm Jumeirah, Dubai. This document provides general rules & regulations for safe and smooth operation in compliance with the requirements of our boating destination. Masters and operators are required to familiarize themselves with these guidelines and ensure compliance at all times.

Responsibility

The master is responsible for ensuring the safe operation of his vessel in accordance with the applicable maritime rules and the requirements of Nakheel's projects, specifically outlined herewith.

Commercial vessel

Anchorage fees will be chargeable to commercial vessels. Tariffs will be shared at time of registry.

Palm Marina Approval

All vessels intending to enter Nakheel's anchorage destination must obtain approval through Palm Marinas. A copy of the following documents must be provided and remain valid throughout the permit duration.

- · Valid operating license
- · Valid insurance
- · Qualified master and crew, with copy of licenses
- · Minimum manning maintained
- · Fitness for duty

RULES & REGULATIONS

Navigation & Routes: All vessels and craft must comply with the requirements as laid down in the International Regulations for Preventing Collision at Sea 1972, as amended.

Berthing & Anchoring: Craft awaiting passengers shall remain at anchor after disembarkation. No water activities are allowed while at the anchorage area. Anchorage is open between 8am-11pm every day. Overnight anchoring must gain prior approvals and will be chargeable.

Speed Limit: Maximum speed upon entry to this destination is 05 knots. Waters of Palm Jumeirah are sensitive to wash from passing craft. The speed limit within the bay is established to protect the islands, piers, jetty and moored craft against erosion and damage. All masters shall ensure that the speed limit is maintained at all times.

Passenger Safety: It is the responsibility of the master and his/her crew to ensure the safety of passengers at all times. All passengers shall be briefed about the safety and emergency procedures onboard the craft and while embarking and disembarking.

This is to inform all the stations that the passage between Dubai Harbour and Palm Jumeirah is STRICTLY SAFE SPEED (5 Knots) and NO WAKES ZONE (Map as attached).

All the boats/Yachts passing through the area, are advised to proceed with SAFE SPEED (5 Knots) AND NO WAKE.

Also, shall comply with the below:

- · Not create disturbance, and loud noise.
- · Have due regards to other users in the area.
- Keep as near to the outer limit of the channel, which lies on her starboard (right) side as is safe and practicable.
- · Not impede the passage of other vessels.
- Avoid anchoring in the channel or at the approaches.

All Boats/Yachts in the area are advised to strictly comply to this circular. Violators will be strictly penalized.

Owners, Agent, Charters, Marinas, Yacht club and Recreational Sailing Organizations shall ensure that the contents of this Circular are made known to the masters or persons in charge of their vessels.

TRANSITING

DUBAI CREEK TO AL JADAF

There are two ways to transit the creek. From the South Entrance or the North Entrance (locally known as the Coastguard side.) The unofficial VHF channel for the creek is VHF CH14, no one follows any rules or uses the VHF. It will be good practice to monitor VHF Ch16 and Ch14 while you transit.

The average depth of the creek from the northern side to the Creek Basin in 7m. A vessel with a draft up to 4m would be able to transit the creek safely. A good rule to keep in mind is "Stick to the middle of the creek"



Al Maktoum Bridge

(Lifting bridge)

Opens for transiting vessels:

Thursday morning Approx. 0100 Sunday morning Approx. 0100

When you see the police vehicle arrive this is an indication the process will begin shortly. The bridge does not have a fixed duration for staying open. Basically as soon as the traffic clears it closes.

There is a green light to the STBD side that will go green once the bridge is fully open. This bridge has +- a 12m gap to pass through. Please be aware of the tide as a current of up to 2kts can be experienced.







Floating Bridge

(Pontoon bridge)

In the center of the bridge, is a hydraulically driven swing gate.



Ghantooth Bridge

16 metres (52.5 ft) Ar draft fixed concrete installations with safe passage marked with lights and signs on the actual bridge



Business Bay Bridge

Fifth bridge air clearance of height of 16 metres (52.5 ft) This area is very well lit at night and more spacious than the rest of the creek



Anchoring (Near Jadaf)

The middle of the creek has an average depth of 7m with mud as a holding ground. The creek basin is deeper nearer to the W - NW side closer to the Al Jaddaf yard between 8-10m
