QATAR

Qatar is where cultural authenticity meets modernity; where the sand meets the sea; where people come together to experience unique offerings in culture, sports, business and family entertainment.



THE ESSENCE OF QATAR

Qatar is a land where tradition meets modernity. It is a country whose people are rooted in their heritage while maintaining an eye on the future, and Qatar's growing global role in business, politics, and education.

There is a deep respect for the nation's history - archaeological sites and artefacts are painstakingly excavated and cared for - protected in-situ or housed in museums. Qatar is home to everything from neolithic rock carvings, modernist skyscrapers and gentle Dugongs in its glittering waters. This is where ancient dwellings are only a stone's throw from world class museums, glistening malls, desert adventures, and international sports venues.

The country's seafaring past today manifests in a continued reverence for the crystal waters that surround the peninsula. GEOGRAPHY

Qatar is a peninsula with a 563-km coastline jutting along the western coast of the Arabian Gulf. The country shares an 87 km land border with Saudi Arabia to the south. Bahrain, the United Arab Emirates, and Iran are nearby.

The country is characterised by its flat and arid desertscape. Qatar has a desert climate with year-round sunshine, hot summers and mild winters. Average monthly temperatures range from 17°C in January to 36°C in July, sometimes reaching highs of 40°C+ during the summer months. Average annual rainfall is 70 mm per year, and falls in brief showers between October and March, rarely hindering outdoor activities.



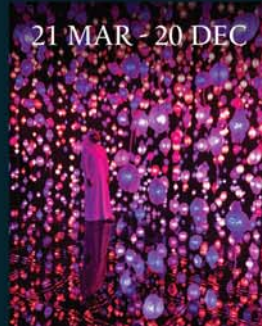

TRAVEL TIPS

A-Z

Qatar is a destination that offers novel, authentic experiences. Here are some tips that will help better navigate the local culture and fully enjoy your time in Qatar.

A

ATTIRE

Attitudes towards dress in Qatar are relaxed, but visitors (men as well as women) are expected to show respect for local culture by avoiding excessively revealing clothing in public. It is generally recommended for men and women to ensure their shoulders and knees are covered.

B

BARGAINING

This is widely expected at Souq Waqif and other traditional markets.

C

CURRENCY

The Qatari riyal is the only currency used in the country and can be obtained through ATMs which are widely available in malls, hotels and around Doha. The Qatari Riyal (QR) is pegged against the US Dollar at QAR 3.64

CURRENCY IMPORT REGULATIONS

When bringing local currency (Qatar Riyal-QAR) and all other foreign currencies amounts equal to or higher than QAR 50,000 must be declared on arrival. This includes jewelry, precious metals or stones valued at QAR 50,000 or higher.

D

DRINKING WATER

The World Health Organization estimates that 99% of Qatar has access to drinkable tap water. However, bottled water is widely consumed in Qatar with plenty of local and imported brands widely available.

E

ELECTRIC SUPPLY

The standard voltage is 240 V and the frequency is 50 Hz. Plug points are the same as in the UK. To use electric appliances made for the range of 100 V - 127 V (as is in the US, Canada and most South American countries), one needs a voltage converter or a combined power plug adapter/voltage converter.

EMBASSIES & CONSULATES

Doha is home to over 100 foreign embassies and a consulate. These are open for business from Sunday to Thursday and closed on Friday and Saturday, as well as all public holidays of both Qatar and the embassy's home country.

F

FRIDAY TIMINGS

All business and commercial activity shuts down during Friday prayers in the morning (around 10am -12pm). Several shops remain closed on Fridays while malls open in the afternoon on Fridays.

G

GREETINGS

Qatari ladies will not shake hands with men, and many men will not shake a lady's hand as a gesture of respect.

H

HEALTHCARE FACILITIES

In case of emergency, visitors can go to Hamad General Hospital's network of hospitals and healthcare centers for care

I

INTERNET CONNECTIVITY

Qatar is the world's first country to introduce a commercial 5G network. Free WIFI facilities are available at the Hamad International Airport and most public places including shopping malls, restaurants and parks.

ISLAMIC HOLIDAYS

Eid Al Fitr marks the end of Ramadan, the month-long period of fasting. It is spent with family and friends, with much feasting, and goes on for three days, though shops and private businesses may reopen after one or two days.

The Hajj pilgrimage ends with Eid Al Adha, also known as the "feast of sacrifice" and continues for four days.

L

LANGUAGE

Home to around a hundred nationalities, Qatar is a melting pot of cultures with numerous languages being spoken. Being an Arab country, the official language is Arabic, but English is commonly spoken at all public places.

M

MEET & GREET SERVICES

Passengers arriving, departing or transiting through Hamad International Airport can avail Al Maha personalised Meet & Greet Services at Hamad International Airport.

O

OFFICIAL HOLIDAYS

Qatar National Day is celebrated on 18 December. Sports Day is also a national holiday celebrated on the second Tuesday of February each year. In addition to these two holidays the country is closed for three days during Eid al Fitr and Eid al Adha.

E

PUBLIC DISPLAY OF AFFECTION

As in all Middle Eastern countries, showing overt affection and intimacy in public is frowned upon.

R

RAMADAN

During the Islamic month of Ramadan, visitors are expected to refrain from eating, drinking and smoking in public places during the daylight hours out of respect to those who are fasting. Hotels continue to cater to guests by opening restaurants that are out of the public's view.

RELIGION

Qatar is a Muslim country and Islam plays an integral role in daily life. Prayers take place five times per day: at dawn (Fajr), around midday (Duhr), in mid-afternoon (A'asr), at sunset (Maghrib) and about two hours after sunset ('Esha). The exact timing varies each day according to the sun's position.

S

SAFETY

Qatar has been ranked first in terms of safety and security, according Numbeo Crime Index 2020, the world's largest database of user contributed data on cities and countries.

SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited in all public spaces including museums, sports clubs, shopping malls and restaurants. Violators can be subject to fines between QAR 1000-3000.

STOPOVER

Passengers transiting through Doha can take advantage of Qatar's unmatched stopover program to explore the destination. The +Qatar program offers great deals at 4- and 5- Star hotels.

T

TIPPING

Most hospitality outlets in Qatar include a service charge in the bill. However, a tip of 10-15% as a gesture of satisfaction is appreciated. It is advisable to carry cash for tipping.

TRAFFIC

Qatar drives on the right hand side of the road.

W

WEATHER

Qatar has a desert climate with year-round sunshine, extreme temperatures during summer and mild winters. Average monthly temperatures range from 17°C in January to 36°C in July, sometimes reaching highs of 40°C+ during the summer months.

Y

YEAR OF CULTURE

Conceived of in 2012 The Year of Culture is an initiative by Qatar Museums. Taking place with another country, the year-long cultural exchange programme invites people to explore a new culture, through a variety of exhibitions, festivals, competitions and events.





Getting around

Public transport

BUS SERVICES

The bus network connects Hamad International Airport to various destinations across the city, offering a convenient transport option. Bus fare can only be paid with a Karwa Smartcard, available at HIA help desks near baggage claim belts 5 & 6.

TAXIS

Karwa taxis offer a convenient and flexible way travel to and from Hamad International Airport. The taxi pavilion is located to the left of the arrivals hall. All taxis are metered and the minimum flag down fare at the airport starts at QAR 25 (USD 7), with cash payments in Qatari Riyal only. Transfer time to the city centre is 30 minutes on average.

CAR RENTAL / DRIVING

There are many local and international car hire firms operating in Qatar, including several with branches at HIA, such as Avis, Budget, Europcar and Hertz. Uber and Careem also operate in Qatar.

DOHA METRO

The state-of-the-art Doha Metro is largely operational, connecting various points of interest across Doha. While currently mostly underground, a tram system is under development, and expected to open shortly.

BEST-IN-CLASS AUTOMATED RAIL NETWORK

Boasting some of the fastest driverless trains in the world, the Doha Metro rapid transit system has three lines: Red, Green and Gold, with 37 stations across 76 km which converge at the centrally located Msheireb Station, close to Doha's main cultural attractions.

Red (coastal) Line connects Hamad International Airport to West Bay, Katara Cultural Village, Qatar University and Lusail.

Green (educational) Line connects Hamad Hospital, Al Bidda park, Qatar Foundation's Education City and Mall of Qatar.

Gold (historic) Line runs through Khalifa Stadium, Villaggio Mall, to Souq Waqif and National Museum of Qatar.

Most stations offer free feeder buses.



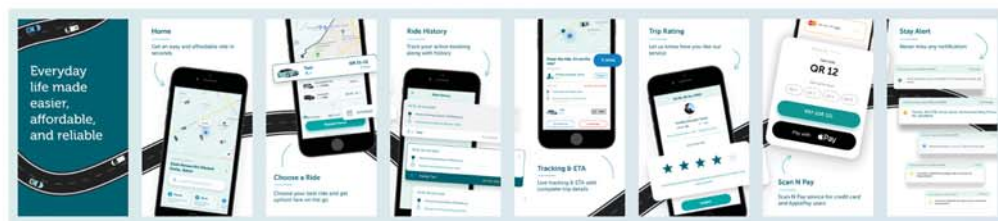

HOW TO OBTAIN

PREPAID SIM CARD?

1. Go to the nearest shopping outlet, Ooredoo business centre, or Vodafone outlets.
2. Collect application form from any authorised vendor.
3. Complete the form in English or Arabic (typed or handwritten).
4. Submit all documents with the form..
5. Pay a one-off fee (cash or credit card).
6. A salesperson will give you a SIM card (with number) on the spot.
7. Buy pay-as-you-go phone cards from shops, petrol stations and supermarkets

What to bring?

1. Passport with visit or residence visa (copy)
2. Ooredoo QR 60-200 to purchase SIM card
(The prepaid sim card is called Hala which is not included)
3. Vodafone QR 35-500 to purchase SIM card



ESSENTIAL

DO's and DONT's

- ✔ Dress modestly.
- ✔ Stand up when meeting new people, older or high-ranking guests. When women enters the room, men are also expected to stand up.
- ✔ Accept food and drinks using your right hand.
- ✔ Buy and drink alcohol only from licensed liquor shops.
- ✔ Ask for permission before you take pictures of UAE National or resident.
- ✔ Be cautious with what you post on social media.
- ✔ Be aware of certain rules of behavior during holy month of Ramadan.
- ✔ Visit mosques – it's a great way to learn about the local religion and culture.
- ✘ Wear shirts that contain text or images that are offensive to religion and culture.
- ✘ Initiate a handshake when meeting with the opposite gender unless they initiate it first.
- ✘ Display any obscene hand gestures in public, use bad language, or show disrespect to the country's leaders, culture, and religion.
- ✘ Show public display of affection.
- ✘ Get drunk, or behave in a disorderly manner in public.
- ✘ Use illegal drugs or substances as these are strictly prohibited.
- ✘ Stay in a private room or car with a member of the opposite sex who isn't related or married to you.
- ✘ Engage in sexual relationships or live together outside of marriage. This is considered unlawful or illegal in the UAE.

KHOR AL UDAID BEACH

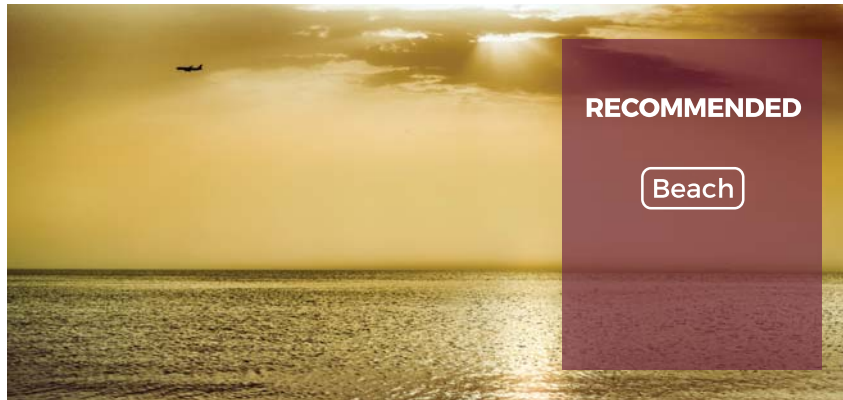

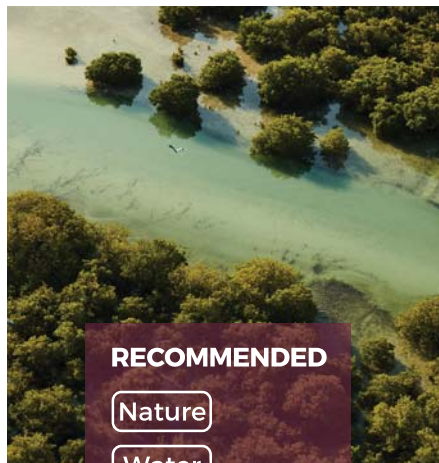


AL WAKRAH BEACH

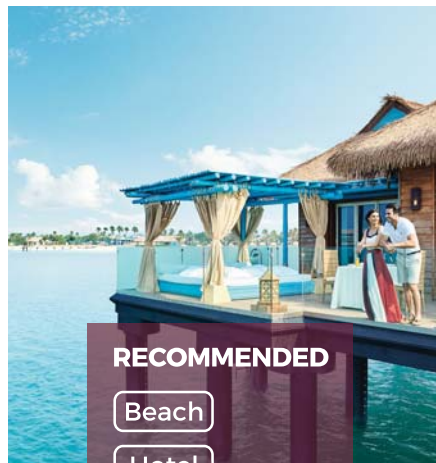

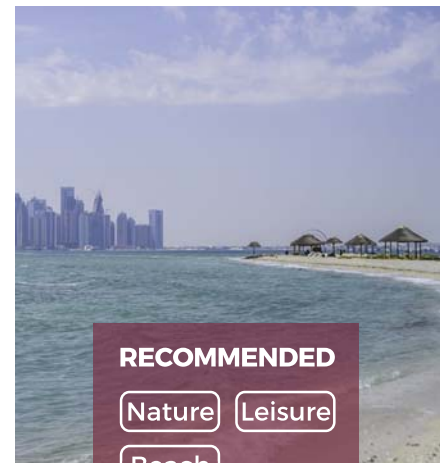

THE PEARL-QATAR

The Pearl, Qatar is a man-made island offshore Doha's prestigious West Bay District, featuring Mediterranean-style yacht-lined marinas, residential towers, villas, and hotels, as well as introducing a luxurious shopping experience with premium designer boutiques and showrooms. The Island is also home to modern dining spots- from refreshing ice creams to five-star culinary experiences, while it stands out for its pedestrian-friendly squares and plazas and the wide range of landscaped gardens.

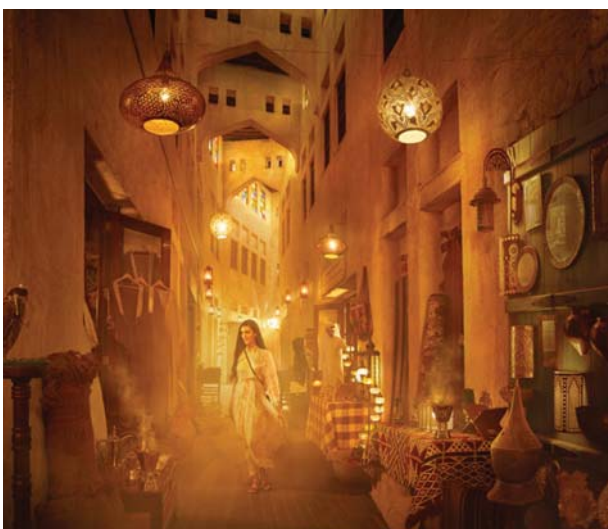
The Pearl is a popular visitor attraction by virtue of its chic elegance, inviting descriptions such as the 'Arabian Riviera'.

Qatar's neighbourhoods boast waterfront views, sandy beaches, retail, exhibition spaces and eateries, reflecting the rich diversity of this tiny state.



QATAR NATIONAL LIBRARY

The Qatar National Library is a futuristic storytelling facility that is recognized by UNESCO, and serves the purpose of not only being a national library, but a research-level university and digital library as well. With access to over a million books the QNL effortlessly allows you to dive into the history of Qatar and learn more about its people, culture and heritage.



SOUQ WAQIF

Built on the site of Doha's century old trading market, on the banks of the Wadi Musheireb, Souq Waqif feels like an anachronism, particularly against the backdrop of Doha's dramatic modernist skyline. With its mud-daubed buildings, the market harkens to a bygone era while remaining a hub of activity, where commerce and gossip collide. Souq Waqif's winding alleys offer a tableau of traditional street life.



AL SHAQAB

Al Shaqab, a Qatar Foundation member since 2004, is Qatar's state-of-the-art equestrian centre, dating back to 1992. It aims to preserve the historical traditions and legacy of the Arabian horses; animals that are highly respected in the country. Home to more than 700 of them, Al Shaqab introduces one of the world's leading and most advanced equestrian programmes based on three main principles - excellence, education and heritage.



KATARA CULTURAL VILLAGE

Combining art galleries and workshops, theatres and performances venues, and exceptional restaurants choices, Katara Cultural Village is Doha's destination for culture and entertainment. A central amphitheatre stands against a backdrop of traditional architecture and cobbled streets, and is the site of many cultural performances. Adjoining the main development, a spacious public beach offers water sports and equipment rentals.



QANAT QUARTIER

A feast for the eyes, this Venice-inspired neighbourhood brings a piece of the Mediterranean to Doha. Boasting turquoise canals flanked by candy-coloured buildings and gracefully arched bridges, Qanat Quartier abounds with Instagram-worthy vistas. Play a tune on the musical staircase, or take a leisurely stroll down broad avenues as you wander in and out of the neighbourhood's many boutiques and cafés. Grab a coffee, stick your toes in the sand, and take in stunning views of the Arabian Gulf from Qanat Quartier's beachfront promenade.



EDUCATION CITY

Education city hosts campuses of leading universities and top tier schools, along with a beautiful park, an abundance of sports facilities, numerous food options, a golf club, a technologically advanced library, a modern art museum, and a few of the most remarkable buildings in the country.



DAHL AL MISFIR

Located west of Doha, in the centre of the peninsula, Dahl Al Misfir is one of Qatar's most exciting natural sites. At 40 meters deep, it is considered the largest and deepest, yet accessible cave in Qatar. Formed largely of fibrous gypsum, it sometimes gives off a faint, otherworldly glow.



IMAM ABDUL WAHHAB MOSQUE

As the largest mosque in Qatar, Imam Abdul Wahhab, also known as the Qatar State Grand Mosque, was inaugurated in 2011. Its simple lines and graceful arches are nonetheless eye-catching, and characteristic of Islamic architectural tradition. The mosque houses three libraries, separate prayer and ablution halls for men and women, and special halls for Quran memorisation, and can hold over 30,000 worshippers.



ASPIRE ZONE FOUNDATION

Located minutes from central Doha, Aspire Zone is marked by The Torch Doha, the 300m tall hotel which boasts panoramic views of the city. With world-class sports venues, a training academy, sports medicine hospital, turf research centre, as well as five-star accommodation, restaurants and entertainment, it is a compact destination for sport lovers. The vast green spaces of Aspire Park, spread over 880,00 m², offer respite from the cityscape, with walking/running tracks, children's play areas, a large lake, and Perceval, a public artwork by Sarah Lucas. Cafés and dining venues dot the area, while Villaggio Mall and Hyatt Plaza Mall provide more entertainment, dining and retail options.



FANAR

One of the most widely known landmarks in Doha, the spiral-shaped Fanar building is centrally located near Souq Waqif and the Museum of Islamic Art. It can be seen from a distance, especially in the evenings when its lighting accentuates the unique design of this beautifully unique piece of architecture. Fanar was once the largest mosque in the country.



THE CORNICHE

One of Doha's most iconic attractions, the Doha Corniche is a seven kilometer stretch of gorgeous promenade overlooking the serene waterfront. With a crescent shaped walkway around the Doha Bay, the Corniche offers the best views of the city's modern skyline, making the epicenter of various occasions such as the National Day celebrations and the National Sports Day.

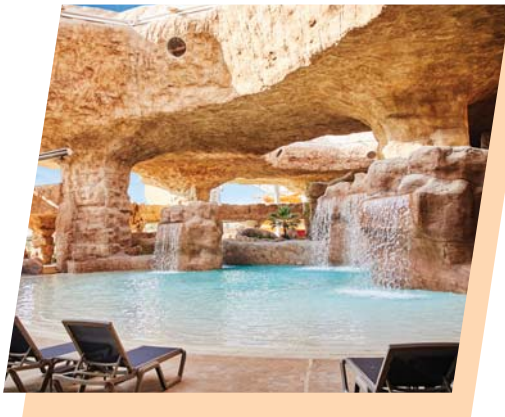

DESERT FALLS WATER & ADVENTURE PARK

The Desert Falls Water and Adventure Park is located at the heart of Salwa beach resort, situated in the southern region of Qatar near the Saudi Arabian border. With over 25 rides, slides and attractions such as the Whizzard Mat Racer, King Cobra and Ship Kids Pool to name a few, this park is one you must not miss while on your holiday in Qatar.



AL JANOUB STADIUM

One of eight venues to host the FIFA World Cup 2022, Al Janoub Stadium, was designed by British-Iraqi architect Zaha Hadid. Located near the former fishing town of Wakrah, draws inspiration from the dhow boats which dot Qatar's waters, and the pearls which were integral to its economy.

The stadium is slated to be used as a local community venue after the competition.



AL BAYT STADIUM

The first match of the first FIFA World Cup 2022™ to take place in the Middle East will fittingly be held in a stadium called home.

Al Bayt Stadium is built in the shape of a traditional Bedouin tent - bayt al sha'ar, a symbol of hospitality in the desert where guests are welcomed from far and wide to relax and meet locals.



DESERT FALLS WATER & ADVENTURE PARK

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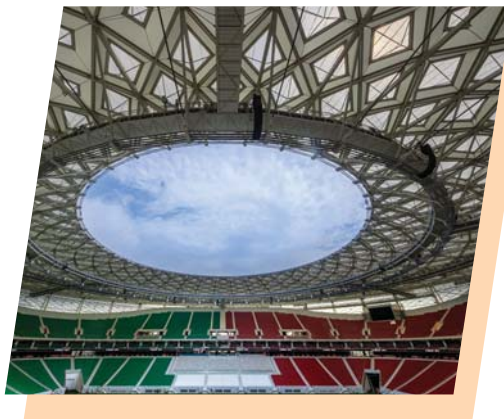
EDUCATION CITY STADIUM

Dubbed the "Diamond in the Desert" owing to its façade, the stadium is shaped like a jagged diamond. Triangles form diamond-shaped geometrical patterns which seem to change colour through the day, as the sun moves across the sky. After the FIFA World Cup 2022™ the stadium will retain 20,000 seats for university athletics, while the rest will be donated to countries requiring sporting infrastructure.



RACING AND EQUESTRIAN CLUB

An impressive and important part of the Arabian culture, horse racing is a first-class activity in Qatar. QREC (Qatar Racing and Equestrian Club) is recognized as the best horse training center as well as a host of international horse races in the country.



AL THUMAMA STADIUM

Inspiration from the gahfiya, traditional headwear in Qatar and across MENA. The stadium's white cladding mimics the complex design of the gahfiya, a head piece worn by young boys before they reach adulthood, at which point ghutras are added atop the gahfiya.

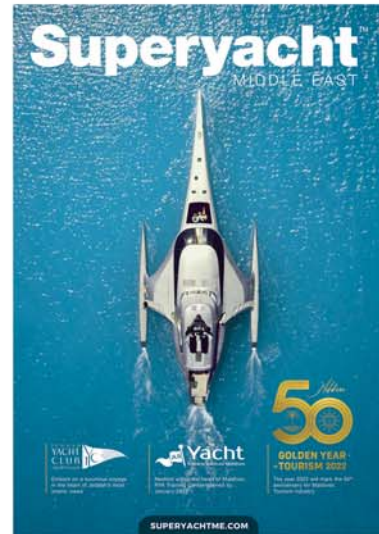


KHALIFA INTERNATIONAL STADIUM
